## GENERAL CONDITIONS

### 1. Entries

All entries must be completed through Stardom. **STARDOM.COM.AU** Entries will open on 1st February, 2026 and close on 22nd March, 2026 **No late entries will be accepted.**

Please ensure that all entry information is correct. Any corrections necessary after the programme is released, which are due to an entrant's failure to supply correct information, will incur an additional entry fee.

Copies of all schedules are available on the Association's website ([launcestoncompetitions.org](http://launcestoncompetitions.org)).

Professional performers may enter as Open competitors only.

A competitor's age shall be reckoned as at 1<sup>st</sup> January. If requested, competitors must be prepared to produce a Birth Certificate.

**Teachers should notify the Secretary of any student requiring special consideration in order to perform.**

**Please note that in 2026 exact numbers performing in group sections need to be advised at time of entry.**

### 2. Programme

The programme will indicate the order in which competitors are to perform. Changes will only be made if permission has been sought from the Stage Manager or Secretary before the respective section begins.

The Committee reserves the right to alter or amend the programme at any time.

### 3. Adjudication

In all classes, prizes will be awarded according to the decision of the Adjudicator, who may not necessarily award any placings in a given section.

Aggregate awards are decided on a point sum basis: First Place 7 points, Second 5, Third 3, Highly Commended 1.

No discussion should be entered into at any time with the Adjudicator.

All decisions of the Adjudicator must be accepted as final subject to the following:

(a) Protests in any class must be in writing, signed and lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the Adjudicator's decision together with a deposit of \$20.

(b) The Committee shall appoint three of its number to a panel of appeal which shall hear any protests as soon as practicable after receipt by the Secretary.

(c) The deposit shall be forfeited if the appeal is unsuccessful.

### 4. Performances

A competitor may not use the same item more than once within a genre (i.e. Music, Speech & Drama, Theatrical Dance) during the same year.

No competitor may use an item with which they have previously been awarded a first prize in any class of the Launceston Competitions for more than two consecutive years.

The Committee reserves the right to disqualify any competitor whose item is deemed unsuitable.

No competitor shall address the audience from the platform either during any session excepting where such address is intrinsic to the performance. Any competitor violating this condition will be liable to disqualification and forfeiture of prizes.

Time Limits will be strictly applied. **Failure to comply with time limits will result in a penalty.**

Every care will be taken for the competitors' safety, but the Launceston Competitions Association will not be responsible for any injury sustained by a competitor during the competitions. Teachers and / or parents should be responsible for basic first aid equipment.

**No performance is to be videoed, photographed, recorded or uploaded to social media.**

### 5. Theatre Rules

Due to fire regulations, teachers are advised that the use of straw or bales of hay is not permitted. **Naked flames are not permitted on stage; this includes candles.** Balloons need to be weighted.

The Committee will not be responsible for music or stage property not claimed on the day of performance unless owners have permission from the Stage Manager to leave these in the venue.

Please ensure that any props, music stands or equipment are at the venue half an hour before the commencement time of the session involved. All props must be named. They must be removed from the stage area after use and not stored backstage.

No food items or liquids are allowed on stage.

All electrical items for use in the venue and dressing rooms must be tagged by a certified electrician. This is the responsibility of each school or teacher and failure to comply will result in the appliance being confiscated.

A sound system is available for use at the venue. Teachers are encouraged to check the sound systems well before they are required to ensure the correct devices are compatible with venue equipment. Competitors are responsible for organizing an operator to play any backing tracks.

### 6. Copyright Bylaw

**Entrants may perform only from original or licensed copies from publishers. Adjudicator's and accompanist's copies may be photocopies. The Adjudicator's copy will be destroyed after the performance.** Competitors are responsible for royalty payments if necessary. The Association will take no responsibility for copyright infringements by entrants.

The decision of the Committee in all questions and disputes arising out of, or not provided for, by these conditions shall be final. All entries received are subject to this provision and will not be subject to any appeal at law.

## SPECIAL CONDITIONS - DANCING CLASSES

Competitors, teachers and parents are strongly encouraged to make themselves familiar with all Launceston Competitions conditions and guidelines to ensure clarity in entries and dance rules.

### **A ENTRIES**

1. A competitor's age shall be reckoned as at 1st January. The Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor to produce evidence to confirm this. Teachers/Dance Schools found to be in breach of age limits for group sections will incur a penalty of \$50.
2. All dancing classes are grouped in divisions. No competitor may enter in more than one class in any division. **Failure to comply will result in a penalty of \$50 and disqualification.**
3. An individual may compete once only in any class whether as a soloist or a member of a duo, trio or group.
4. Restricted Classes are for competitors who have not received first or second placing in the type of dance section entered in any Tasmanian eisteddfod (Launceston Competitions, Launceston Festival of Dance, Burnie Eisteddfod, Devonport Eisteddfod and Southern Tasmanian Dancing Eisteddfod). Restricted competitors cannot enter Championships, Speed Tap, Slow Tap and Broadway sections. Competitors may return to restricted status after three years. This does not include competitors who have won prizes in 6 Years & Under sections.
5. **Championship sections can only be entered by dancers who have been placed first or second in a non-restricted section in the relevant dance style in any Tasmanian eisteddfod (Launceston Competitions, Launceston Festival of Dance, Burnie Eisteddfod, Devonport Eisteddfod and Southern Tasmanian Dancing Eisteddfod. A competitor entering a Championship section must perform one (1) other solo in an open section (from any genre). This solo does not include a second Championship.**
6. A competitor in the Championship section must return to the open section if they had not received a first, second or third placing in the genre entered in any competition/eisteddfod within three years prior to the current year.
7. It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure that all entry information is correct.
8. The names of all entrants in duos and trios **must** be supplied at the time of entry. The Secretary must be informed prior to the commencement of the competition if an unavoidable change of competitor must be made.
9. Dance students who teach on a casual or part-time basis and who do not derive the majority of their income from performing or teaching in the dance industry are permitted to enter sections based on their age.
10. A group must consist of a minimum of four competitors.
11. The Committee reserves the right, if there are insufficient entries in any section, to join classes with the next age of same section. In the event of excessive entries, the section may be divided.
12. Only classes in which two or more entries have been received, will be counted towards aggregate trophies.

### **B VENUE RULES**

13. Official sound equipment is to be operated by Teachers and the Stage Manager only. I Pad, computer, I Pod may be used. Back up lap top - USB can be used with computer. Teachers and competitors are encouraged to check the sound systems well before they are required to ensure the correct devices are compatible with venue equipment.
14. SOUND LEVEL - The Adjudicator has the right to control the level of any amplified sound in the venue.
15. Theatre etiquette is to be observed at all times. No yelling, whistling etc., before, during or after performances in the auditorium or backstage is permitted.
16. Permission must be sought from the venue Technician or Stage Manager where it is planned to use material on the stage surface before commencement of session. Glitter is not permitted
17. No rehearsals will be permitted in the theatre during the week of the dancing sections.
18. With the exception of Character Solos, curtains must not be used for solos, duos or trios.
19. Lighting effects will only be available during evening sessions for approved classes. In Tap Solos and Duos, National Solos & Duos and Classical Solos, lighting effects must not be used. Lighting may be used for National Theatrical Duos.
20. Lighting request forms for an evening item must be submitted by 5 pm on the day of performance.

21. Please ensure that any props, or equipment are at the venue half an hour before the commencement time of the session involved. All props must be named. They must be removed from the stage area after use and not stored backstage.
22. All electrical items for use in the venue and dressing rooms must be tagged by a certified electrician. This is the responsibility of each dancing school and failure to comply will result in the appliance being confiscated.
23. **No performance is to be videoed, photographed, recorded or uploaded to social media.**
24. **SOCIAL MEDIA** Defamation of character on social media towards any person involved in the Launceston Competitions will not be tolerated.

## C PERFORMANCE RULES

25. **Role of the Stage Manager.** Competitors, teachers and others associated with competitions must obey the directions of the Stage Manager at all times when in the area of the stage.
26. Time limits will be strictly enforced. Where items are more than 10 seconds in excess of the prescribed time limit, the teacher of the competitor will incur a penalty of \$50.00.
27. Competitors must restrict bows and reverence at the conclusion of performance to enable the smooth flowing of the program.
28. No competitor may use an item with which he or she has previously been awarded a first prize in any class of the Launceston Competitions for more than two consecutive years.
29. No prompting or assistance of any kind may be rendered to a competitor in any class during a performance.
30. **Outside assistance in Song & Dance sections.** Assistance in singing by teachers or non-members of the group is not permitted. If recorded music is used, it must not contain any speaking or singing when the competitor is, or competitors are, singing.
31. **Restarts.** A competitor who commences an item and stops, may be allowed to re-start the item at the discretion of the Adjudicator. An item will be adjudicated normally if the cause of the re-start was the fault of the sound equipment, or an accident beyond anyone's reasonable control.
32. Competitors perform at their own risk. Every care will be taken for the competitors' safety, but the Launceston Competitions Association will not be responsible for any injury sustained by a competitor during the competitions.
33. Teachers and / or parents should be responsible for basic first aid equipment.
34. **Acro-Tricks.** Teachers are responsible for ensuring that all tricks and movements including acro steps performed by their dancers are technically appropriate to each dancers' level or ability. Launceston Competitions will not be held responsible for any injury that may be sustained during any dancer's performances.
35. **Offensive Material/Performances** will be terminated by the Adjudicator and or the Committee.
36. **Hosiery must be worn by all girls in dance performances or the competitor will not be eligible to perform.**
37. **Hosiery can be footed, footless, stirrup, knee or mid-thigh length.**
38. The decision of an Adjudicator is final, no discussion or correspondence is permitted. Medals and other special awards will only be made where performance standards satisfy the Adjudicator.
39. **NO COMMUNICATION WITH THE ADJUDICATOR** is permitted by entrants, teachers or family members. Following a breach of this rule, or any other, the entrant may become ineligible for a placement.
40. If an Adjudicator cannot perform his/her duty through unforeseen circumstances, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute adjudicator.

## D GENRES

### National

Folk or Traditional dance choreographed to appropriate music and traditional costume.

### Classical

A routine which includes classical steps, technique and movement, performed to classical music.

### Character or Demi-Character

Routine portraying a character and story in the style of Classical dance.

### Contemporary/Modern/Lyrical

A routine which may be one of or combine the following:

contemporary / modern (abstract concepts that explore movement), lyrical (using lyrics and mood of music to express movement).

**Jazz**

Routine choreographed using jazz techniques to a variety of music.

**Tap**

Routine is choreographed utilising tap techniques.

**Song & Tap and Song & Dance**

Routine must contain both singing and dancing.

**Broadway**

Routine is theatrical in nature and is choreographed to music, in the style from a Broadway show. Singing is not permitted.

**Non Competitive Group**

Any form of entertainment. Competitors must not perform in any other competitive group.

**Kicking Routine**

All kicks must be from the hip. Open - 100 kicks, Under 16 - 80 kicks, Under 12 - 60 kicks.

**Hip Hop**

A street style of movement characterized by bounces and rocks.

**Champion Group**

Any form or dance. No vocals. Time Limit 15 minutes.

**Special Stage Presentation or Scena**

Dancing, singing or any other feature may be introduced. No vocal backing whilst singing.

A deposit of \$100 is required with entry - redeemable upon performing. Time Limit 30 minutes. including set up.

COMPETITORS PLEASE NOTE:

1. Age groups will be determined on number of entries. Dancers are to enter one level only and be registered at date of entry.
2. Age for Highland sections must be as at date of competition.
3. Classification will be as per R.S.O.B.H.D. Scheme for Pre-Premier Dancers.
4. Aggregate trophies for winner and runner-up will be presented at each level, with the exception of Primary, using the official R.S.O.B.H.D. scrutineering system. Special dance sections will not count towards aggregate.
5. Medals will be awarded as sectional prizes.
6. All Premier Dancers may enter both Highland Title and National Dance Title sections.
7. Premier Level Dancers must also be aware of, and obey, the 8 dance rule as set down by the RSOBHD.
8. Premier with Restrictions Special Dance Section can only be entered by those dancers who have not been placed first, second or third in any registered Championship since 1st January, 2025. The overall Premier with Restrictions Trophies will be calculated on the results in Title sections.
9. Any complaint made by an individual against the organisation or adjudication of an event must be made in writing, giving the complainant's full name and address, and shall be lodged with the organiser if possible on the day of the event and certainly not later than 48 hours after the event. Such complaint to be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00, which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
10. Changing facilities will be available for both female and male dancers. Dancers are expected to be appropriately attired at all times within the venue and not display underclothing such as bras, crop tops or underwear.
11. Any rules pertaining to competitions or Championship, released by RSOBHD or ABHDI from the time of printing this syllabus/schedule to the date of competition or Championship will be adhered to.

  - \$15.00 per National Dance Title - covering all three dances.
  - \$8.00 per single dances and Special dances.
