# TROPHIES, MERIT AWARDS, PRIZE-MONIES

## DONORS OF TROPHIES

We seek the assistance of Donors to have all trophies handed to the Secretary prior to the relevant Class being held. This will allow presentation to take place at the conclusion of that Class. Donors of dancing trophies are requested to pass their trophies into the Secretary by the commencement of the first session on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July.

## PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Current holders of perpetual trophies are requested to return these to the Secretary by the first session of the week in which the respective trophy is due to be awarded. **Schools are urged to pay particular attention to this request.**

## PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES

Owing to the length of the final dancing session, Judge's Choice and Aggregate trophies only will be presented at that time. With the exception of Championship trophies, all other trophies will be available for collection from the Secretary's office at the conclusion of each class.

## CERTIFICATE OF MERIT

All competitors who perform in the Launceston Competitions are eligible to purchase a 'Certificate of Merit' as a permanent record of their achievement. The cost per certificate is \$1.00 and available from the Secretary's office. There is no limit on the number which may be purchased.

## PAYMENT OF PRIZE-MONIES

Where possible, prize money will be paid in cash at the end of each Class. Cheques will be sent by post to Group or School Competitors.

### CREATIVE WRITING

Ms Tamara Foster

Tamara Foster spent over 40 years teaching English and Humanities subjects in Northern Tasmanian High Schools and Colleges. At the centre of her teaching practice was the desire to instill in her students of love of language and literature, to discern how the way words, either spoken or written, can make an impact.

A strong supporter of public speaking and debating throughout her career, she also relished the creative writing component in English subject courses. Since retiring from full time teaching she relishes having more time to read widely and undertake volunteer ushering for a range of musical theatre and ballet productions. As a consequence, she continues to be a strong advocate for young people and the talent abounding in our community. She is a member of several Arts and Heritage organisations and celebrates the vibrancy of cultural endeavours across the state.

### SPEECH & DRAMA

Ms Jacinta John

Jacinta is the international Associate Director of *Moulin Rouge! the Musical*, with staging territories including the World Tour; South Korea, Japan and Australia. She is also the Associate Director for *Beetlejuice the Musical*, Australia. She was the Resident Director on *Billy Elliot* and directed the world premiere of the Air Supply musical *All Out of Love*. Jacinta toured Australia as the Resident Director of *Mamma Mia!*, was Assistant, then Resident Director on *Matilda the Musical* for its inaugural Australian and New Zealand seasons, and worked as Assistant Director on the world premiere of *Groundhog Day* at the Old Vic Theatre, London.

Jacinta directed the musical *The Hatpin* (Victorian College of the Arts), was the Resident Director for the Australian touring production of Agatha Christie's *A Murder is Announced*, and she was the Assistant Director on the musical *Miracle City* at the Hayes, Theatre, before which she worked as a performer for several years.

Jacinta trained at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, and in Viewpoints and Suzuki Methods (SITI, New York); she has a Bachelor Arts in Film and Performance Studies from the University of Sydney, and an Australian Music Examinations Board Associate Diploma in Speech and Drama.

Allan has held positions as a Music Educator and Director of Music at several Melbourne schools. In addition to his teaching roles, he is also an accomplished sound and lighting technician, contributing to both school and theatre productions.

He is the founding member of the Allan Hessey Big Band, which has performed at numerous events across Victoria. Earlier in his career, Allan toured nationally as a trumpet player with the Moscow Circus and continues to work as a freelance musician in Melbourne. His performance experience spans musical theatre, orchestral work, and solo engagements.

Allan is also honoured to perform *The Last Post* at ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day services throughout Melbourne.

He studied at the Victorian College of the Arts and completed his Bachelor of Education at the University of Melbourne.

## **HIGHLAND DANCING**

Mrs. Judy Niven

I started Highland dancing at the age of 5 and as well as Highland, I studied Ballet and Modern Dance and in later years Tap.

Over my time, I competed successfully in many Championships around Australia. My biggest thrill was travelling to Scotland and competing at the "Worlds" in 1984.

At 18, I started my dancing school, which I ran for many years. I also became involved in displays and choreography and performed in numerous events and Tattoos. In 1992, I co-produced inaugural Victorian State Committee Variety Concert, which still runs today.

I have been judging around Australia and overseas for 30 years. My second biggest thrill was being invited to judge the "Worlds" in 2018, which was a wonderful experience.

I am also involved in Highland Dancing administration - as Technical Secretary, and then as President of the Victorian State Committee of Highland Dancing, and Senior Vice-President of the Australian Board of Highland Dancing. I am currently the President of the Victorian State Committee of Highland Dancing once again.

Highland Dancing has given me amazing experiences, fantastic students, and wonderful lifelong friends. I am thrilled to be coming to Tasmania again to take part in the Judging panel for Highland Dancing.

## **THEATRICAL DANCE**

Mr. Christopher Favaloro

Christopher Favaloro, originally from Sydney, studied at Newtown High School of the Performing Arts, and further continued his studies at Ev & Bow Full-time Dance Training Centre. At 18, he represented Sydney Dance Company for the International Mayors' Congress commissioned by APEC. In the same year, Christopher joined Melbourne Ballet Company as a soloist for their 2008 and 2009 seasons, *Emerge* and *Believe*.

In 2009, Christopher was one of a select few accepted into the Cirque Du Soleil database, and was also awarded his Solo Seal by the Royal Academy of Dance. Christopher then went on to assist Sarah Boulter in teaching the top 4 contestants for the television show, *So You Think You Can Dance Australia* (Season 2 & 3). Soon after, he began touring Australia with Jerome Robbins' timeless classic, *West Side Story* as Shark boy, Anxious in 2010 & 2011. In 2012, Christopher joined Mod Dance Company as a Principal Dancer under the direction of Brett Morgan and Graeme Murphy performing signature works by Graeme Murphy entitled *Suite Synergy*.

Throughout his career, Christopher has performed and toured in several shows with Opera Australia across Australia. These include Baz Luhrmann's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, *The Merry Widow*, *Don Giovanni*, *The Magic Flute* by Julie Taymor, *Orpheus in the Underworld*, *Ballo*, *The Love of Three Oranges* and Graeme Murphy's *Aida*. From 2014-2018, Christopher toured internationally with *Cats* - The Musical in the iconic role, Mr. Mistoffelees to great acclaim.

Since returning to Australia, Christopher guest teaches and adjudicates across Australia as well as internationally and is passionate about sharing his knowledge of the professional industry to aspiring, young performers.


